Flexible Professional Learning Options

Self-Guided Online Courses. Two self-paced online courses allow teachers to see video demonstrations, practice what they have learned, and join a discussion board to reflect on their personal experiences. Each course comprises three sessions that last approximately 30–45 minutes.

• Growth Mindsets

Based on the groundbreaking work of Carol Dweck, we brainstorm strategies for changing a "fixed mindset" (the idea that basic human qualities like intelligence or talent are fixed traits) into a "growth mindset" (the conviction that most basic abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work).

• Best Practices for Student Engagement

• Vocabulary Building

Our focus on vocabulary-building strategies improves student retention of key terms essential for academic success. According to researchers such as Robert Marzano, approximately 55% of the vocabulary needed to be successful in school comes from social studies.

Onsite Options. Because the best training sessions are designed with specific participant outcomes in mind (Guskey, 2000), we partner with you to define your goals and customize how we can meet them.

• Onsite Trainings

Dynamic demonstrations and discussions guided by a Certified Facilitator acquaint participants with StrataLogica's array of resources and lead the way to mastery of the program's functions. One onsite training session for a maximum of 25 participants can be structured as full day (seven hours) or half day (two three-hour segments).

• Onsite Visits

Visits create opportunities for an array of learning options, including classroom demonstrations, individual or group coaching, short Q&As, and after-school training sessions. All visits are seven hours of custom training executed by a Certified Facilitator.

• Onsite Meetings

District leaders meet Certified Facilitators for seven hours to plan professional learning, correlate Active Classroom activities to district and state standards, and arrange any other support needed for implementation.
